GOAL:

The State of Louisiana requires the services of qualified contractors to provide for the safe management, collection, removal, decontamination, transportation, treatment and disposal of Ebola Virus Disease (EBV) contaminated materials and/or potentially contaminated materials.

CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must comply with the terms and conditions outlined in 49 C.F.R. Parts 171-180
- Persons must comply with the Security Plan Requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR), when applicable.
- Registration required by 49 C.F.R. 107.601 et seq., when applicable
- Each Hazardous Materials employee as defined in 49 C.F.R. 171.8, who performs a function subject to the remediation of Ebola, must receive training required by 49 C.F.R. 172.704.
- Must comply with application of special permit provisions as defined in 49 C.F.R. 107.105.
- The motor carrier, including its driver, must comply with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), 49 C.F.R., Parts 300-399, as applicable.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The contractor shall serve as a consultant for the State of Louisiana in the management, collection, removal, decontamination, transportation, treatment and disposal of EBV contaminated materials and/or potentially contaminated materials.

Services provided by the Contractor(s) may include, but are not limited to, the following tasks:

- Management of all contractor activities.
- Collection and removal of all materials potentially contaminated with the EBV at the site in accordance with the Center for Disease Control (CDC) updated recommendations, including but not limited to personal protection equipment (PPE), decontamination and packaging of materials for transportation to a treatment facility in accordance with the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) Category “A” infectious materials.
- Decontaminate all persons, property, materials, items, etc., that have been, or had the potential to be exposed to the EBV.
- Transportation of the materials, including decontamination materials, in accordance with the US DOT Category “A” infectious materials regulations to a treatment facility by a registered Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) and Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) solid waste transporter. Transporter must also obtain a

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special permit from the USDOT for the safe transport of EBV contaminated materials and/or potentially contaminated materials.

- Treatment by incineration at a permitted hazardous waste or solid waste facility or other LDEQ authorized facility at a temperature of 2100 degrees Fahrenheit or the current temperature established by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- The ash must be tested, as appropriate, prior to transportation to ensure it is not a Category “A” infectious waste.
- Encapsulation of the ash at the site where waste was incinerated) prior to transportation to a permitted hazardous waste disposal facility or other site authorized by LDEQ. If the ash is mixed with hazardous waste, a land disposal restriction determination must be made prior to encapsulation.
- Transportation of encapsulated ash by a registered LDH and LDEQ solid waste transporter to a permitted commercial LDEQ hazardous waste disposal facility or other LDEQ approved site in accordance with the Solid Waste regulations.
- Disposal of encapsulated ash in a LDEQ permitted commercial hazardous waste disposal facility or other facility authorized by LDEQ.
- Must meet all current CDC recommendations for management, collection, removal, decontamination, transportation, treatment and disposal of EBV contaminated materials and/or potentially contaminated materials.
- Must meet all current USDOT regulations for safe transport of EBV contaminated materials and/or potentially contaminated materials.
